A-G Requirement and Courses for College Entrance

A.	<p>History (2 Years)</p> <p>One year of world cultures, world history, or geography; one year of U.S. History or U.S. Government.</p>
B.	<p>English (4 Years)</p> <p>Four years of English courses that require frequent and regular practice in writing expository prose compositions of some length.</p>
C.	<p>Mathematics (3 Years)</p> <p>Math I, Math II, Math III</p> <p>A 4th year is highly recommended.</p>
D.	<p>Laboratory Science (2 Years)</p> <p>Minimum of two full year courses such as biology, chemistry, earth science, physics and any other approved lab science course.</p> <p>3 years recommended</p>
E.	<p>Language other than English (2 Years)</p> <p>Two separate full year courses focusing on grammar, vocabulary, reading, composition and the development of listening and speaking skills.</p> <p>3 years recommended</p>
F.	<p>Visual and Performing Arts (1 Year)</p> <p>Must be a year of course work in visual or performing arts.</p>
G.	<p>College Predatory Electives (1 Year)</p> <p>One additional year to be chosen from the following: English, history, advanced mathematics, laboratory science, language other than English, Social Science, performing arts, CTE or fine arts. In general, electives courses should involve considerable reading and should aim to develop the student's analytical reasoning ability and skill with written and oral expression.</p>
