WELCOME to the 2025-26 School Year!

Connections Visual and Performing Arts Academy is a full accredited charter school for students in grades 7-12 focusing on visual and performing arts, integrated with Summerville High School. Connections has been recognized by the US News and World Report as a top high school in the United States in 2013, 2014, and 2016.

Connections VPAA opened in 2002 and now has 157 students. Students have the opportunity to work with a choir director, choreographer, and accompanists in the vocal choir program. In theatrical productions, students are coached by directors, vocal directions, and choreographers. Costume and set designers assist in creating professional-quality productions. Students in the ballet/dance program are taught by a professional dance instructor, and both the dance and ballet classes perform in a recital at the end of the year. The band members are in the Orange Crush and Zero Hibernation Jazz Band. Each year, film and art students screen their work at the Academy Art and Film Festival, and several student films have been screened at independent film festivals.

There are no attendance boundaries for Connections VPAA, so any student who lives in Tuolumne, Calaveras, Mariposa, or Stanislaus County is eligible to attend. Students enrolled in Connections must maintain grades of C's or better in their courses.

Connections VPAA students are able to enroll in all academic, athletic, and extracurricular programs available at Summerville High School. The focus on arts programs allows for a large variety of elective classes in their arts for students in both school programs, including piano, guitar, art, photography, drama, film, choir, band, and dance.

Graduates from Connections VPAA have attended: The American Musical and Dramatic Academy, Occidental College, Berklee College of Music, Stanford, Notre Dame, UC Berkeley, UC Davis, UC Irvine, UCLA, UC Santa Cruz, UC San Diego, USC, UOP, University of Portland, Western Washington University, and many California State Universities. Several graduates have traveled as cast members for the Young Americans.

All students enroll in eight classes. Class periods are 90 minutes long with four classes meeting on A days and 4 classes meeting on alternate B days. School begins at 8:00 and ends at 3:05 on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. School ends at 2:15 on Wednesdays.

Graduation Requirements

Eight consecutive semesters of English

Two semesters of World History; two semesters of U.S. History; one semester of U.S. Government; one semester of Econ/Civics.

Six semesters selected from mathematics course offerings required of all students. All students must complete one year of Algebra or Math I.

Four semesters of science required: one year Physical/Earth science, one year Biology/Earth.

Students must be enrolled for each of the first four semesters of high school. Four semesters must be passed.

FINE ARTS/FOREIGN LANGUAGE...... 10

Students must pass one year of a foreign language, art, music, film or drama. Students may substitute one year of career technical education (CTE) courses for graduation requirements.

One semester of Health and one semester of Keyboarding during the freshman year and two semesters of Senior Seminar in the senior year.

OTHER COURSES......110

As indicated by major course of study and student's life plan.

a) Students transferring into the District from another high school shall be awarded credits toward graduation based on courses completed elsewhere without penalty resulting from variation of local requirements.

b) Students earning a comprehensive diploma must successfully complete a senior project.

College Entrance Requirements

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA/ CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS

A-G Coursework Subject Requirements

A. History/Social Science	2 years (1 year of US History or 1 semester of US History and 1 semester of civics or Government AND 1 year of social science
B. English	4 years (Composition, Literature, etc.)
C. Mathematics	3 years, Algebra 1 and Algebra 2 and 1 year of Geometry; OR Math I, Math II, Math III; 4 years recommended
D. Laboratory Science	2 years, one of Biology and one of Chemistry or Physics. 3 years recommended
E. Foreign Language	2 years of same language required; 3 years recommended
F. Visual or Performing Arts	1 year
G. College Preparatory Electives	1 year coursework in addition to minimum requirements in subjects listed above

Students interested in applying to a UC campus need to complete the 15 A-G requirements, with at least 11 finished prior to the beginning of their senior year, with no grade lower than a C, and at least a 3.0 GPA in these courses. Students need to complete the SAT test with essay or the ACT with essay no later than December of their senior year. The SAT subject tests are not required for admission but certain majors on some campuses recommend them. Students may apply between November 1 and November 30 of their senior year.

Students interested in applying to a CSU campus need to complete the A-G requirements with no grade lower than a C. Students need to complete the SAT or ACT no later than December of their senior year. Some campuses, such as Cal Poly, recommend students take the SAT or ACT no later than November of their senior year. Students may apply between October 1 and November 30 of their senior year.

NCAA Information

Students who may compete in athletics at the university level in a Division I or Division II institution must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center. There is no deadline to register, but it is recommended by the NCAA that interested students register during their junior year.

Students must complete a certain number of core courses with a minimum GPA, and earn a minimum score on the SAT or ACT. For more information, go to <u>www.web1.ncaa.org</u>.

Connections Visual and Performing Arts Academy Academic Agreement

It is the philosophy of Connections Visual and Performing Arts Academy to provide a balance, rich, and strong artistic and academic environment. Students who attend the academy must show an interest in being involved in our arts curriculum, and understand the parameters as set forth in this agreement between the school and the student with his or her parents.

- 1. Students must maintain grades of "C" or above in all of their coursework.
- 2. Students must maintain at least 90% attendance.
- 3. Students will be placed on academic probation should one or more of their grades fall below a C for the semester or their attendance drop below 90%. They will have one semester to show improvement or risk being removed from the Academy.
- 4. If it becomes clear that the student is not completing assignments or not demonstrating effort in class, they may also be removed. This will not take place until after a parent conference is held.
- 5. Students must maintain good behavior and follow the district's discipline guidelines. If a student at the Academy is determined to have violated a policy that results in suspension or have repeated discipline consequences, they may be removed from the Academy.
- 6. Cell phone use Cell phones are prohibited during class time.
- 7. Students will participate in all standardized tests (Smarter Balanced, etc.)
- 8. Parents are encouraged to follow their child's progress by using the District's "Powerschool" program linked to our school website. They are also courage to become an active participant in their child's education by communicating with teachers and the principal when needed.
- Parents are also encouraged to attend Connections Advisory Board meetings to give input on activities and curriculum related to the program and/or participate in C.A.S.T., the Creative Arts Support Team.
